IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE

WISHIN is working with numerous organizations that have expressed interest in participating in WISHIN Pulse. Collectively, the organizations have locations in 56 of Wisconsin's 72 counties and represent more than 750 points of care and 70 percent of annual inpatient discharges in Wisconsin.

Many WISHIN customers are beginning to "sponsor," financially or otherwise, organizations with which they typically exchange health care information. They are seeing value in, for example, including nursing homes to which they typically discharge patients becoming part of the WISHIN network.

PHARMACY DATA

The Clinical Advisory Committee and WISHIN clients have consistently advised us that access to pharmacy data through WISHIN would be clinically valuable.

The Department of Health Services has submitted a request to CMS for 90/10 (90 percent federal, 10 percent state match) funds to allow Medicaid pharmacy claims data to flow to WISHIN and be available within the WISHIN Pulse community health record. This data could populate the community health record on a near-real-time basis.

In addition, we are now working with the state's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) to make information about prescribed controlled substances available through WISHIN Pulse.

IMMUNIZATION DATA

The CMS funding request also includes a proposal for bidirectional integration of the Wisconsin Immunization Registry (WIR) and WISHIN Pulse. When complete, this functionality will allow organizations to automatically submit required immunization data to WIR and will allow the display of WIR data in/through WISHIN Pulse.
