

WISHIN Pulse

Pulse is a community health record

- Aggregated summary of patient information from multiple organizations
- > A longitudinal view of patient health information

> Pulse can include the following data types:

- ADT (problem list, allergies, diagnoses, etc.)
- Laboratory & pathology results
- Radiology results
- Transcribed reports
- ▶ EKGs
- PDMP integration
- Medicaid prescription fill
- ▶ WIR integration
- Pulse can deliver Public Health Syndromic Surveillance and Immunization data to Wisconsin Division of Public Health (Meaningful Use)

New Since Last Summit

- Integration with cloud-based EHRs (eClinical Works, Athena, PointClickCare) more to come.
- > Community CCD/available through query-and-retrieve process
- > Partnership with state of WI
 - Progress on SSI Care Plans
 - Potential project re: new PHSS technical standards, pending CMS approval

 - ▶ 18 payer clients (incl. all Family Care and BadgerCare MCOs)

A New Era of Interoperability

- Non-government initiatives (Sequioa Project/eHealth Exchange/ Carequality) developing frameworks to advance/standardize electronic exchange of health information and facilitate interstate exchange
- Federal government asserting more control (21st Century CURES Act/TEFCA, ONC "information blocking" rule, CMS rule): less carrot, more stick.
- On the state level, Medicaid MCOs incentivized (not required) to participate in WISHIN.
- The role of "public" HIEs like WISHIN in the new interoperability environment.










WISHIN Pulse - Patients by County



WISHIN Pulse Patients as % of Total County Population


WISHIN Pulse Sites by County






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WISHIN Pulse users queried more than 427,000 patients and viewed more than 1.44 million records in 2019 (not including automated query-and-retrieve transactions)





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


